

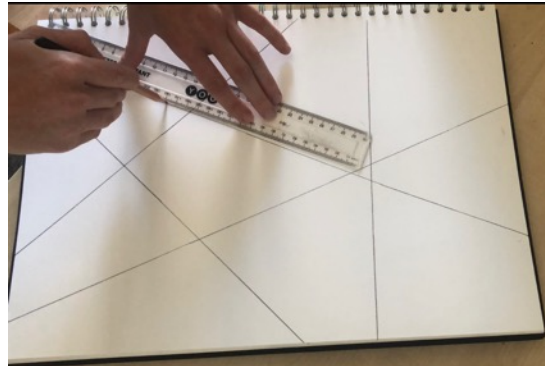
## Lesson 2 – To start the drawing for your abstract London artwork – inspired by Fernand Leger’s work ‘The City’.

For this lesson you will need a collection of images that remind you of London. You can use the mind map we created last lesson for ideas! You might research some images you want to use or use the ones provided below. Using images to help us with our work means we can achieve more detail and accuracy.

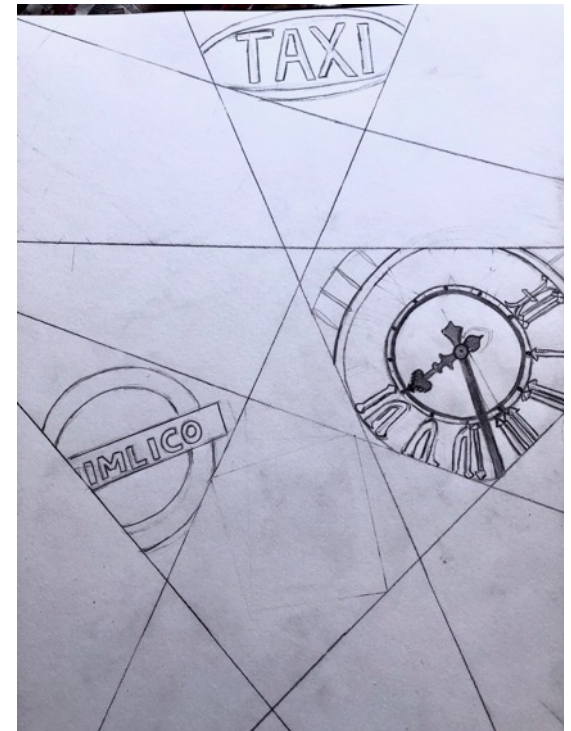
A video will be available on YouTube on the channel ‘Miss Linehan Primary Art’ from 27/04/2020 to supplement this lesson.



**Step one:** You will need a piece of paper, ruler, sharp pencil, sharpener and rubber for your work.



**Step two:** Using your ruler draw about 7 straight lines across your page from one side to the other in all different directions. They must go across the page and not stop in the middle.



**Step three:** Start to choose parts of the images on your page to copy carefully into the sections. Take your time we will have two lessons to complete the drawings. You can make these as simple or as detailed as you like – choose your challenge! You might even enlarge some parts of the images.

**enlarge:** to make something bigger than it is.

In this case you might take part of an image and make that fill a whole section rather than drawing the whole thing.



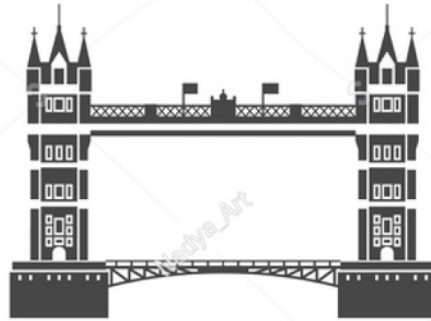
